Escape the winter blues with our wonderful Roecliffe news!

• Year 6 SATS update

Due to the additional bank holiday in honour of the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III, which will take place on Monday 8 May 2023, it has been necessary for the DfE to amend the dates of the KS2 SATs tests as this date clashed with the first day of SATs week. The new KS2 test schedule in May is as follows:

Tuesday 9 May: English grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS) papers 1

(questions) and 2 (spelling)

Wednesday 10 May: English reading paper

Thursday 11 May: mathematics papers 1 (arithmetic) and 2 (reasoning)

Friday 12 May: mathematics paper 3 (reasoning)

• Police visit to Roecliffe

Maths update

We are excited to announce that our children are now able to access the Times Tables Rock Stars app using their logins and passwords which have been provided in hard copy letters this afternoon. Children in Years 2 - 6 are now able to practise their multiplication facts at home using the Times Tables Rock Stars app which will complement the daily practice which takes place at school with children in Years 2 - 5.

• Active Learning training at Roecliffe

We were delighted to host a training session for teachers from primary schools across our region at our school today. The PE and sports staff who attended the Move and Learn training were able to develop their understanding of how to teach children incorporating activity and movement as research shows that this supports children's ability to learn. All our children take part in active learning and this has been developed at Roecliffe since September and our aim is to embed this and develop it further throughout the rest of the year.

Forest Church

We hope that the following information from Rev Karen is useful for our parents: NEW THIS YEAR.... OUTSIDE DUNSFORTH CHURCH ON THE SECOND SUNDAY OF THE MONTH, STARTING 8TH JANUARY 4PM.

Forest Church is a meeting to worship God which takes place outside and which takes account of the seasons and the outside space. It meets outside at all times of year (so you need to dress appropriately) and aims to help people connect with God as the creator and carer of the natural world. Forest Church helps us to connect with God by reminding us of our own interconnectedness with the whole of creation including one another.

Forest Church will include singing and simple prayers and readings and will last around half an hour in the winter months. It will also include practical activities – looking, listening, making and engaging.

Forest Church might appeal if you:

- Sometimes feel that you feel closer to God on a walk or in the garden than you do in a Church building.
- Sometimes find you don't relate or that you "switch off" in a traditional Church service.
- Are young (or any age!) and don't like sitting still, but feel more comfortable doing something. Forest Church is suitable for everyone from babies upwards, as it is possible to wander around while taking part and it is very interactive.
- Relate strongly to environmental concerns.
- Would like to engage in something spiritual in a less structured setting.
