# Music Intent

*'Music is a universal language that embodies one of the highest forms of creativity. A high quality music education should engage and inspire pupils to develop a love of music and their talent as musicians, and so increase their self-confidence, creativity and sense of achievement.'* **National Curriculum 2013**

**At Roecliffe C of E Primary School, our intent is:**

- **To provide children with enjoyable experiences so they have a positive attitude towards music.**
- **To expand children's knowledge and appreciation of music by providing them with opportunities to listen and explore different genres and composers.**
- **To encourage children to develop a 'have a go' attitude and self belief to explore different ideas when composing and performing music.**



# PHSE Implementation

**At Rocliffe C of E Primary school, we use a scheme called Kapow, which provides us with a well planned progression so children can continue to develop their knowledge as they progress through the school. This starts from Year 1 and continues through to Year 6.**

**Children will have opportunities to have hands on experience within their music lessons. They will be able to work collaboratively with others and also have the opportunity to work independently.**

**In EYFS, children have the opportunity to join in singing on a daily basis. Children also have a stage outside where they can use instruments to create shows and music.**

**During collective worship, music is played as the children enter. Each day is a different composer and this provides the opportunity for children to listen to a range of different composers and genres of music.**

**There are opportunities for children to take part in extracurricular activities, such as guitar lessons - which are available for children to do within school time.**
