Maths - Nursery



- Our aim this year is for children to be confident with:
 - Counting to 10 with 1:1 correspondence
 - Recognising their numbers to 10
 - Recognising common 2D shapes
 - Be able to spot patterns in their surroundings
 - Start to use mathematical language such as: in front, behind, next to, bigger, smaller etc.

Enquiry Based Learning



- In Class 1, we have adopted the enquiry based learning approach.
- This helps our children to question things more and find out different ways to retrieve information.
- In nursery, we are building the foundations of this and promoting curiosity.
- This can be helped at home by encouraging your child to ask questions and find out answers. This will need to be modelled.

How you can help your child at home

Before your child starts reception, here's some things you can do at home:

- To try and be as **independent as possible** taking themselves to the toilet.
- To recognise their name when they see it.
- Practise counting using one to one correspondence.
- To have lots of conversations and explain new vocabulary.
- Read stories every day - children should have at least **5 stories a day**.
