The children will: 1. Students should understand the causes of global warming and climate change. 2. Describe the impacts of global warming and climate change on the natural and human environment, including the melting of polar ice caps, rising sea levels, and changes in weather patterns. 3. Students should be able to explain the consequences of global warming and climate change for different regions of the world, including the potential for increased famine, drought, and displacement of people. 4. Students should be able to analyse the responses to global warming and climate change from governments, organisations and individuals.	Spring 2 History: The Ancient Greeks How did the Ancient Greeks shape the world we live in today? The children will: 1.1. Demonstrate knowledge of the Ancient Greek civilization, including their geography, culture, politics, and society. 2. Understand the difference between primary and secondary sources and use them to explore historical events from different perspectives and evaluate their reliability. 3. Analyse and interpret a range of Ancient Greek artefacts, texts, and images and inter information about their daily life and customs. 4. Discuss the impact of the Ancient Greeks on Western civilization, including their cultural and scientific achievements.	Spring 1 Food technology- celebrating culture and seasonality The children will: - Understand the concept of seasonality and its importance in food production and consumption. - Identify and classify seasonal fruits and vegetables grown in the UK. - Demonstrate knowledge of the different seasons and the impact they have on food availability. - Use seasonal ingredients to plan and prepare a balanced menu for a specific meal. - Explore and compare traditional British dishes associated with different seasons.
